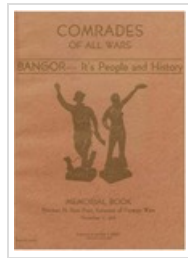

Gradually, the war drew into its orbit 61 states (including the USSR and the United States), inhabited by 80% of the world's population; it lasted six years and cost about 60 million lives. Causes of World War II. In one of the warring factions were Germany, Italy and Japan, the second - Britain, France and the United States. Millions of people were killed at the front, were in occupation or in the Nazi camps. However, Germany did not achieve its strategic objectives capture Leningrad and Moscow. Results of the Second World War led to major political changes in the international arena, the gradual development of the trend towards cooperation among states with different social systems.
